The **GLOBAL VILLAGE** is designed to educate festival-goers about different aspect of a specific culture through its traditions, art, customs, dress, music, dance, and history. Festival-goers of all ages should feel as if they have “walked through” a particular village and experienced the everyday life of its people and culture.

GLOBAL VILLAGE REGULATIONS:

- Each area must be fully decorated with typical items representing that culture.
- Sound amplification of any kind at the individual booths/village areas is *completely prohibited*.
- Each booth must be attended throughout the day by community volunteers or booth organizers.
- Food and drink may not be sold or distributed in the Global Village.
- The Global Village allows the sale of culturally appropriate items. Items cannot be food.
- Participants cannot promote partisan or religious causes or organizations.
- Participants must remain within their allotted space and respect/collaborate with other participants.
- The festival will be responsible for tents, chairs, tables
- Global Village area organizers must be able to attend planning meetings and approve the display area in advance.
- Booths wanting electricity must bring a commercial extension cord. (Thick, orange, 3-prong)

ENTERTAINMENT IN THE VILLAGE: Music, dance, and song are integral parts of village life. To make sure that each area is able to share this part of their culture with festival-goers, a stage will be located in the Global Villages area.

SETUP: **Friday, October 4th, from 1 to 5 p.m. or Saturday, October 5th, from 6 to 8:00 a.m**

- Park Police will provide security overnight on Friday
- All areas must be set-up by 8 a.m. on Saturday
- Vehicles are not allowed to drive on the grass. Access will be through nearest paved areas. After unloading, vehicles must park in designated areas only.

BREAK-DOWN:

- **The Global Village will close at 6:00 p.m.**
- Booth organizers may begin breaking-down at 6:00.
- Organizers are responsible for leaving their booth areas free of litter and other debris.
